Prizes for those visiting all ten shops include: \$500 shopping spree at one or more of the shops, \$25 gas cards, \$25 gift certificates from the shops, and gift baskets. Heritage will have at least one in-shop prize drawing. Some of the other shops may have in-shop prize drawings as well.

Note: if you are traveling on 71 Hwy to Heritage, the 163<sup>rd</sup> /Y Hwy exit is **CLOSED**. You will need to take either the 155<sup>th</sup> Street exit or the Hwy 58 exit. Right on the 155<sup>th</sup> Street exit & turn left onto North Scott. It will turn into Hwy 58 and intersects with Y Hwy.

## Semi-Annual Bolt Sale

Beginning Tue, **Oct 6** and running through Sat, **Nov 7** every displayed bolt will be on sale **20%-60%** off the regular price, with 1 yard minimum cuts. The 10% End-of-Bolt discount will apply with the exception of the bolts on clearance; these will be the bolts marked down to 60% instead of their usual 50%. Each bolt will be color coded with dots indicating the discount amount. You have an entire month to shop, but the selection is best the first week of the sale.

## Patriot Day Special

Friday, September 11 is Patriot Day. In honor of all Patriots, I will discount the new Armed Forces fabrics 30% that day only. The 4 branches I have are: Air Force, Army, Marines and Navy.

Also, I encourage anyone that has a loved one serving in the military to register his or her name on the Prayer List available at the shop. These Patriots will be prayed for daily. I do ask one favor...please provide me updates on your Patriot. Pictures are nice to see also!

## **Quilting 101 Beginners Class**

Heritage is happy to offer once again a beginners quilting class. If you have been making quilts for awhile, you may be bored, but if you have a friend that wants to learn let them know about this very basic class. It begins with quilting terminology, moves on to rotary cutting, machine piecing, quilting and binding. Each student will piece a quilt top, prepare it for quilting, quilt and bind over the 6 weekly, 2 hour sessions. A sewing machine will be required for classes 3 - 6. Both daytime and evening classes are offered. Sessions begin Thu, **Sep 24** from 2:00 - 4:00 and again from 6:30-8:30. At this time there are only 2 spots left in the Evening class. The class fee is \$75; half is paid at registration with the balance payable by the 1<sup>st</sup> class. Instructor is Leona Ragsdale.

Class fees are non-refundable unless the class is cancelled by the teacher/shop or if the student cancels at least 1 week prior to the registration deadline. Students receive a class discount of **20%** on fabrics and supplies used for class. It is customary to purchase class fabrics and supplies from the shop offering the class. Heritage thanks you for following this policy so we can continue offering you classes. Preferably, children should not attend classes unless the child is a student of the class as they may be distracting to others.

## **Monthly Quilt Clubs**

**Main Street Strippers** - This quilt club offers educational programs, fun projects - such as a Round Robin, show-and-tell, and members make a yearly fund raiser quilt for a local charity. The club meets at Heritage on the second Tuesday of each month. The next meeting is Tue, **Sep 8** at 6:30.

**Scarlet Thread Quilters** - This quilt club primarily focuses on making quilts for various charities. Show-and-Tell and instructional programs are a part of most monthly meetings. You are welcome to come visit the club at 5:30 on the fourth Tuesday of each month; the next meeting being on Tue, **Sep 22**.

These 2 Clubs are open quilting clubs that meet at Heritage, but are independent of the shop. Members range from beginner to advanced and there are no dues. Members receive a 10% discount off regular priced items at Heritage each meeting.. Visitors are always welcome.

## **Heritage “Block of the Month” Clubs**

Your kit will include the “appliqué” block fabric needed for finishing in addition to the fabric for block 9.

## **Kansas Troubles Stash Society**

Heritage is happy to offer this new Club from Kansas Troubles Quilters. It is pretty simple. There is a yearly fee of \$50. There are 3 meetings per year. Attendance is not required. At each meeting you will receive four KT patterns exclusive to the Society. Members will be the first to see the newest KT fabric line and each member will receive the equivalent of a yard of the new line. It can be a one yard cut, 2 half yard cuts, 4 half quarters or a charm pack. The color of the month is brown. A KT pattern prize drawing will be a part of each meeting. But that's not all! Members will receive a 25% discount on the new line of fabric and 40% off all other KT fabrics. These discounts are offered only 3 times a year (every 4 months). Because I don't want to be here until midnight cutting the fabrics at each meeting, a member may shop anytime using the discount **once** per each 4 month period.

The date of the first meeting is Thu, **Sep 10**. The daytime meeting will be 2:00; evening at 6:30. If you can't make a meeting you may stop by the shop anytime after Sep 10 to pick-up your patterns and "one yard" of fabric. Registration has begun. When you register you will be asked how you want to receive your "one yard" (a yard, fats, 2 halves, etc) and color preference. The fabric line for the first KTSS meeting is "Vine Creek". It is possible to join the Society after the Sep meeting. You choose when you want your "year" to begin.

## **Kansas Spirit**

Okay, we are back on track now. The next block is The Road to the White House on page 65. The book mentions that this block is similar to Road to California on page 23. I also noticed that the block is the same as Broken Sugar Bowl (appeared in the KC Star 1942) block being made in the Victory Garden club. Regardless of the name, the kit will be available on Wed, **Sep 16**. Only one more block after this one!

The next meeting will be held a week early on Sat, **Sep 12** at 11:00. The meeting will be back to the third Sat in Oct. There will be a make-up class the Saturday following the October meeting.

## Recipe of the Month

### Frozen Chocolate Banana Bites

*These are easy and inexpensive. This would be a perfect snack for kids to make themselves. It's also a fun after-school treat.*

- 1 4oz. box of instant chocolate pudding mix
- 1 ½ cups half and half
- 2 medium-sized bananas

In a medium-sized mixing bowl whisk together the pudding mix and half and half until fully combined and it begins to thicken. In a small bowl mash the peeled bananas with a fork. Whisk the mashed bananas into the pudding. Line 3 mini-muffin pans with paper liners. Fill the cups ¾ full with the pudding mixture. Place in the freezer on a level surface for 1 hour or until frozen. When ready to eat, gently peel the paper liner off and enjoy!
